Subject           **TARGETS FOR 2010/11**

## **Purpose of Report**

1. The purpose of this report is to make recommendations to the Police Authority for proposed performance targets for 2010/11. The range of targets includes measures from the National Indicators, together with additional measures that will contribute towards the HMIC Police Report Card assessment. Additional local targets are included that supplement these statutory indicators.

## **Background and methodology**

2. Although there has been a move to a single measure of confidence by which the Home Office will judge the performance of the Force and the wider police service, the full suite of Statutory Performance Indicators (SPIs) introduced in 2008/09, will be carried forward to 2010/11. Thus data will continue to be collected and reported to the Home Office and will be used by HMIC alongside qualitative assessments within the performance framework of the Police Report Card.
3. The development of proposals for a target for each SPI has involved discussion between Corporate Development staff and individual Chief Officers for each indicator within their own respective portfolio of responsibilities. The rationale behind the proposals has already been discussed by Chief Officers with members of the Police Authority, and the proposals have been placed before the Performance Panel for consideration. The performance target proposals are summarised in Appendix A.
4. Once the targets for 2010/11 have been confirmed these will be cascaded out to CDRP's to ensure a common approach to Crime Reduction and Detection targets across the City, County and Rutland.
5. Appendix A provides a summary of targets across the entire basket of measures and the detail behind these proposals has already been discussed with members at the Performance Panel meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2010. Key points to note are:
  - a) Performance will be tracked across all measures even where it is proposed that no formal target should be set this year in order to fully understand Force performance relative to peer Forces – anticipating the HMIC assessments of relative performance.
  - b) Targets are designed to build public confidence in the police, and to tackle crime and anti-social behaviour issues in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland.

## **Recommendations**
